## Greetings from the President

If I were to select a word to describe this past fiscal year, it would have to be EXPANSION, and its variations thereof. The Board of Directors and the CAAHEP staff have worked diligently to expand the avenues of communication, expand the services offered to the Committees on Accreditation and expand the roster of professions participating in CAAHEP.

This year CAAHEP offered several services to benefit our Committees on Accreditation (CoAs) and our accredited programs. We began with a summer workshop that focused on communication and professionalism. In September CAAHEP sponsored a Generalist Site Visit Workshop in New Orleans. Twenty-five volunteers participated in a two-day training seminar to develop site visitors who would serve in a 'generalist' capacity. It is through this type of training that CoAs can be provided a qualified pool of site visitors for their programs. Your Accreditation Mentor (YAM) was posted on the CAAHEP website to assist new program directors with basic tools for addressing accreditation processes. CAAHEP offered several Webinars that addressed issues any CoA or program director might face, including improving response rate for surveys, understanding standards and addressing complaints and appeals. The Leadership Conference in January assisted CoA chairs by providing topics on CAAHEP policy interpretation and assessing student learning outcomes.

CAAHEP expanded the services and information provided by the CAAHEP website and Hub. Sample CoA policies, site visitor agreements and letter templates were made available. Communications went 'greener' by electronic distribution. This also allowed for more frequent and timely publications.

CAAHEP expanded their policies to address alternative models of education. Definitions for distance education, satellites and add-on tracks were clarified. Other policy changes addressed confidentiality and conflict of interests. With the exit of the Committee on Accreditation for Respiratory Care, a new policy was developed to address how recommendations would be handled should a CoA give notice of its intent to withdraw from membership in CAAHEP.

Despite the fact that we lost a Committee on Accreditation (CoARC) in November, CAAHEP gained two new committees in April: Anesthesia Technician/Technologist and Recreational Therapists. We also gained two Sponsoring Organizations: The American Society of Anesthesia Technicians and Technologists and the American Therapeutic Recreation Association.

Our Executive Director, Kathy Megivern and her staff expanded their workload as they worked diligently toward achieving re-recognition from CHEA, the Council for Higher Education Accreditation. This year-long process began with a successful Application for Eligibility and Recognition. In the coming year CAAHEP will complete a self-study and host a site visiting team.

Lastly I want to acknowledge all the volunteers that work tirelessly for the benefit of programmatic accreditation. The number of hours required to review program documents, complete reports, travel as site visitors, and attend meetings is countless...Thank You. As our CAAHEP responsibilities continue to expand, let's not forget that we work for the benefit of the thousands of students attending our accredited programs as well as the public our graduates will serve.

# Year in Review

## Growth

The continued growth in the professions participating in CAAHEP is testament to the importance of assuring a well-prepared and qualified workforce of professionals in health care services. In 2010, the Anesthesia Technicians/Technologists and the Recreational Therapists joined in the ranks of professions whose programs will be accredited by CAAHEP. With these professions, two additional sponsors became members of the Commission—the American Society of Anesthesia Technologists and Technicians and The American Therapeutic Recreation Association—and two Committees on Accreditation were formed as well. All were approved by the Commission at the April Annual Meeting.



## Re-Recognition from Council for Higher Education Accreditation

Over this past year, CAAHEP has been going through the re-recognition process through the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA). Similar to our accreditation process, CAAHEP has had to submit an Application for Eligibility and Recognition Review in order to begin their two-step process. We were approved as “eligible” in September 2010 (Step 1), and the process of completing a self-study in preparation for a site visit in early 2011 is underway. The CHEA recognition criteria are extremely thorough and now that CAAHEP has been deemed eligible, CHEA will provide public notice that CAAHEP has requested a recognition review. The process has brought on some strengthened procedures to ensure CAAHEP that our Committees on Accreditation are following CAAHEP policies in their reviews, including a paper audit of one program from each CoA and a site visit review of one site visit for each CoA. These two new procedures are conducted by the CAAHEP Liaison to each CoA.

## New and Updated Standards

Several CoAs reviewed, revised, and/or created new Standards for their profession this year, which were then approved by the CAAHEP Board of Directors. These include the Accreditation Review Committee for the Anesthesiologist Assistant, the Joint Review Committee on Education in Cardiovascular Technology, the National Commission on Orthotic and Prosthetic Education, and one of CAAHEP's newest professions, Committee on Accreditation of Recreational Therapy Education.

## CAAHEP Webinar Series

CAAHEP conducted a very successful series of webinars this past year on a variety of subjects for both the leadership of the Committees on Accreditation and program directors and staff of CAAHEP accredited programs. The series consisted of four programs:

- GoToMeeting/GoToWebinar: Another Value Added Benefit of CAAHEP
- CAAHEP Standards and Guidelines: Why, What, and How
- Complaints, Appeals and Lawsuits: What EVERY CoA Needs to Know
- Innovation and Outcomes: Evaluating Ways to Improve Survey Response Rates



The three programs strictly for CoA staff were intimate programs with limited attendance, which allowed all attendees to have input, ask questions, and participate. The program on survey response rates was a huge draw for program directors, with nearly 150 participants. During this session, participants were able to ask questions electronically that were then shared with the entire group. The series received outstanding reviews from attendees.

## Meetings, Presentations & Resources

From the webinars, to meetings and conferences, to the items provided on the CAAHEP website or on the Accreditation Services Hub, CAAHEP has continued to provide useful tools and accreditation resources. At the Leadership Conference in January 2010, a number of Standards and policies issues were addressed, and a program on Assessing General Student Learning Outcomes was conducted by Dr. Susan Hatfield of Winona State University.

At the CAAHEP Annual Meeting in Louisville, Kentucky, in April, an aggressive line-up of programs was presented including two simulation demonstrations—one from the Perfusion program which was conducted at the SUNY Upstate Medical University in Syracuse, NY, and video cast in the meeting room, as well as a demonstration of the iStan robot, a METi simulator used to enhance clinical learning opportunities. Attendees also learned about what to expect from the “Generation NeXt” as these young individuals leave school and enter the workplace, and were presented with an update on Reforming Health Care in America and an update on higher education activities in Washington.


During the Summer CoA Workshop in New Orleans, the CoAs discussed the challenges that come with accrediting distant education programs, from conducting site visits to issues with externships. In addition, the Accreditation Review Council on Education in Surgical Technology and Surgical Assisting (ARC/STSA) conducted a program on their recently developed Standards Interpretation Guide. This useful tool was generously shared by the ARC/STSA with all CoAs and is now posted on the CAAHEP Accreditation Services Hub.

## Accreditation Process Enhancements and Changes

CAAHEP continued to modify and improve the governing documents that outline the accreditation process throughout the year as necessary. These changes to the Policy and Procedures Manual, along with the Standards template, have been necessary to clarify processes, address changes and answer questions that arise and have included such items as Ethical Standards and Conflict of Interest, a clarification of Items Not Requiring Board Approval, issues dealing with Distance Education, as well as Add-on Tracks and Satellite Programs, along with others. A change in the quorum requirement of the CAAHEP Bylaws was approved by the Commissioners at the Annual Meeting in April.

## Communications

Over the past year, CAAHEP has taken steps to increase the communications to and among our Commissioners, Board of Directors, CoA Staff and Chairs, and other parties of interest, while striving to reduce costs. Our regular newsletters received new looks, and several new publications were added. All CAAHEP publications are now distributed electronically, which has saved on costs while increasing our



ability to rapidly and effectively distribute information. Our Commissioners are now receiving the electronic bulletin, “*For Commissioners Only,*” which highlights events and activities. The frequency of CAAHEP’s newsletter, *Communiqué*, was increased to six times per year and the distribution list was greatly expanded. A new column that reviews specific CAAHEP Policies and how they came about was added to the *CoA Notes* monthly newsletter. CAAHEP also entered the social media scene with the addition of a Facebook page. In addition, there have been numerous enhancements and updates to the CAAHEP website throughout the year, and our web presence continues to grow. The site averaged just over 40,000 visitors each month over the past year, with the “Find an Accredited Program” page the most popular page viewed every month. It is on this page that visitors to the website can search for programs by profession and location, and then link directly to the accredited program’s website.

## Recognizing Excellence

Nearly every year, CAAHEP has recognized an individual for outstanding dedication and support to the Commission by presenting them with the highest honor awarded —the CAAHEP Award for Exceptional Service. This past year, the Award for Exceptional Service was presented to Lindsay Rettie for her many years of services to the organization. The award is reserved for those who are or have been Commissioners, and recognizes her for her efforts in speaking with conviction about the work of the Commission, advancing the organization’s purpose, and actively participating in the Commission’s activities at a high level for many years. Lindsay Rettie has served as a Commissioner representing the Association of Schools of Allied Health Professions, she completed two terms on the CAAHEP Board of Directors and continued as a non-Board Liaison even after completing her term on the Board.

In addition, a Presidential Citation, was presented to Jennifer Anderson-Warwick for her assistance and dedication to CAAHEP over the past year. Jennifer works with two Committees on Accreditation and has assisted CAAHEP in getting its webinar series up and running. She has assisted in the training of different Committees on Accreditation in using the Go to Meeting/Go to Webinar software, and serves as a non-Board Liaison to a CoA and as a member of the CAAHEP Standards Committee
